We are seeking ex-serving Defence members and their families who have had contact with emergency services related to suicidality.

Are you an ex-serving Defence member who has had contact with Queensland emergency services during a suicide crisis?

OR

Are you a family member of an ex-serving Defence member who has had contact with Queensland emergency services during the veteran's suicide crisis?

The Gallipoli Medical Research Foundation (GMRF) aims to explore the lived experiences of ex-serving Defence members who have been involved in a suicide-related call to emergency services, in addition to examining the experiences of their family and emergency services.

We are seeking:

- Ex-serving Defence members who have had contact with emergency services (Queensland ambulance or police) in relation to their own suicidality; or
- Family members (e.g. partner, other family member over age 18) of an ex-serving Defence member who have had contact with emergency services (Queensland ambulance or police) in relation to the veteran's suicidality.

What is involved:


You would take part in one individual interview to talk about your experience interacting with Queensland emergency services for suicidality. Your privacy is very important and will be protected. We will not share your name or personal details.

The interview will be conducted either face-to-face at GMRF (located at Greenslopes Private Hospital, Brisbane) or via video conference.
